## Sport Premium Funding



### 2019-20

Our allocation of PE and Sport Premium for the academic year September 2019 to August 2020 is estimated to be  $\pounds$ 17,910.

The breakdown of how we plan on spending the money is as follows:

## £4800: Swimming

We have spent some of our budget on swimming lessons for Year 4 and 5 (2 x two weekly intensive courses) and a two week booster session for Year 6. This is to improve the swimming achievements for children who have already met the requirements of the national curriculum programme of study. For those who have not met the requirements of the programme of study, money has been allocated from the main school budget.

## £5,600:

In addition to the two sports clubs staffed internally, we have employed external coaches to deliver a range of clubs including: street dance, cheerleading, yoga, rugby, boxing. These equate to us offering 8 extra-curricular activities per week, enabling us to encourage participation of as many children as possible. We are also broadening the range of sports offered to enable children to participate in sports they would not have had access to previously.

# <u>£1,500:</u> Teaching Assistants working with coaches to support the sessions and develop their knowledge of coaching sports sessions

We have a teaching assistant at each club so they can improve their own skills and support the coaches in teaching the children new skills. They support the attainment of children in sessions and use their new knowledge and skills to target next steps. By involving internal staff in sporting activities, we hope this will contribute to sustainability through confidence gained from upskilling through the CPD opportunities offered.

#### £600.00: Purchase of new sports equipment in response to resource audit

We have purchased new sports equipment for a range of sports, including new equipment for sports day.

#### £600.00: Updated scheme of work

We have bought into a new and more current Physical Education scheme of work. We hope this will maximise teaching and learning opportunities as well as enabling the HLTA who delivers PE to upskill his teaching further and support progression and assessment within the subject.

#### £250.00: School games organisation- Bronze package

We would eventually like to achieve a School Games Mark award, therefore we have purchased a package which allows specialist sports coaches to support us to work towards this. Additionally, this allows us to participate in external school competitions. We are also planning to carry out intra-school competitions this year and as this is something we haven't done before the school games organisation will support us with this.

## £720.00: CPD Dance and Throwing/catching

PE CPD for subject leader. 12 weeks of coaching/team teaching from BURY FC. Shared planning and assessment tools which will be shared with the HLTA who delivers PE. We hope that this will increase the confidence of the HLTA to deliver dance. Additionally, this will support us with assessment of PE and progression of skills across all key stages.

We plan to spend some of the remainder of our budget on CPD/enhancement for the HLTA who delivers PE across the school. We will be investing particularly in dance CPD (as this is now a huge focus within the primary PE curriculum).

#### Year 6 Cohort - Swimming Results

Swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres -52%

Use a range of strokes effectively- 34%.

Perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations - 27%.

In order to accelerate the progress of our children in swimming and improve percentages we are running intense swimming courses for years 4, 5 and 6 throughout the next academic year.
